STEM: Underwater Robotics

In collaboration with the Shedd Aquarium, Gurrie Middle School is offering and new and exciting club for students to be a part of. Students will learn engineering, programing, and robotics while designing an underwater remotely operative vehicle or ROV. The goal of this hands-on club is to engage students in STEM and expose them to science and technology careers; as well as encourage students to develop and apply technical, teamwork, and problem solving skills. The club members will participate in a final state-wide competition at the Shedd Aquarium in March, testing their ROV's skills in the water.
