




Pet Parade Reminder





This awesome looking reptile is a **Frill-necked Lizard**. They can mostly be found in Australia. When the lizard is frightened, it gapes its mouth, exposing a bright pink or yellow lining. The frill flares out as well. It can reach sizes of 91.4 cm long which is pretty big. Its skin is a darker color than its frill. They eat beetles and cicadas and also termites. They favorite food is butterflies and moths. The only time they go into the ground is in for search of food. So, that means they spend most of their time in trees. The can be kept in captivity like zoos.



This funny looking animal is a **Proboscis Monkey**. These poor little guys are threatened, which means they are endangered animals. Males are much larger then females. The males' noses can reach about 7inches long. They have a large belly because of their diet. Their belly weight is about a quarter of their body weight. They mostly eat leaves and also seeds. You can find some of them in 16 protected areas. When males get mad their noses swell with blood.



This is a **Flying Fox** which is a bat. They are the largest bat in the world. They also can be called fruit bats. One their toes they sharp curved claws. They have a wing span of 6ft. their weight is 1.5kg or 3.3lbs. They do not have a tail. They are frugivores, which means they eat fruit. They are mammals.

As a little boy, he often impersonated him. He was known as 'Little Elvis' when he was a boy. Mars moved to Los Angeles, California at the age of seventeen to pursue a musical career. After being unsuccessful with Motown Records, he signed a deal with Atlantic Records.

Bruno Mars received several nominations and won two awards for his songs. One of them was a Grammy for



Best Male Pop Vocal Performance for the song "Just the Way You Are." His second award was a Soul Train Music Award for Song of the Year for "For Nothin' on you."

They can live from 10 –18 years in captivity (that means in places like zoos).

They are carnivores, which means they eat meat. When a coyote is running to catch prey, it can reach speeds of 43mph.

When they jump they can reach a distance of more than 13ft.

Most coyotes travel in a pack.

Coyotes become full sized within their first year.



### These Weird Animals Will Blow Your Mind!

The blob fish is a freaky animal that lives in the deep sea. You rarely will see a blob fish. It lives at depths of 800 meters. They can be found off the coast of Australia and Tasmania. You can catch them with nets (they are vulnerable against being

caught) when you're bottom trawling, which is dragging a net across the sea floor. They are facing extinction from over fishing in the deep sea. They can grow to 12 inches. They eat sea urchins and mollusks. They lay one thousand of eggs at once.



The star nose mole is very interesting. It's very small and it has a thick brown waterproof fur. The adults measure 15 to 20 cm long. They weigh about 55 grams. They have 44 teeth. They have scaled feet and a long tick tail (their tails are used to store fat). It has pairs of pink fleshy points on their nose. They use the points to feel the food because they're blind. They can

be found in the wet low areas in eastern Canada and the north eastern United States. They are semi-aquatic mammals. These moles dig tunnels under ground. They eat insects, and worms.



**The pink fairy armadillo** is 90 to 115 mm long. They have a long tail. They have a pale rose or pink color. The pink fairy armadillo can burry itself in seconds if frightened. This

animals is nocturnal. They burrow in small holes by ant colonies. The pink fairy armadillo eat ants, and ant larvae, and sometimes they eat worms, snails, insects, and larvae. They spend most of their time underground.



**The Long-eared Jerboa** is a nocturnal animal. They are a mouse like rodent. They have a long tail. Also they have long hind legs for jumping. The long-eared jerboa has large ears

(it says it in their name!). They live in a desert habitat like the Gobi desert in Mongolia. Their length is70mm to 90mm. The tail measures 150mm. The long -eared Jerboa can jump 40mm high and it weigh 23.7 grams. Their predators are owls.



**The Patagonian Mara** is the 4th largest rodent. It's also known as the Patagonian Cavy. It lives in central and south Argentina. It lives in the grassland, scrubs desert and it burrows.


They eat grasses and other vegetation. They are mammals. The head to body length is 75cm. The weight is between 9 and 16 kg. They are related to guinea pigs. They have 3 sharp claws. They resemble long eared rabbits.



The sea lion has ear flaps, long front flippers and they can walk on all four legs. Sea Lions have hair that is short and thick, and they have winged feet. These animals live in the tropical waters of the world in both the northern and southern hemisphere, and in the northern Atlantic



ocean. The sea lion is classified as a marine mammal. The males are called bulls, and the females are called cows; their babies are called pups. A large group of sea lions are called colonies. Can you believe they can dive up to 600 feet? They can stay under water for 40 minutes before they have to breathe again. They can swim as fast as 25 mph. They usually only move as fast as 10 mph unless there's danger.
