

forth to the end, but the Bruins will be the stronger team and win the series in seven games.



For now.


Movie Review: It's Hard Knock Life

6th Grade Field Trip to Mars

3....2....1....BLAST OFF! This quarter, the 6th grade classes traveled to the Challenger Learning Center (aka Mars). In Science class, we learned about the jobs we could apply to be during the mission. The jobs are: Communication Officer, Isolation Specialist, Life Support Scientist, Navigator, Probe Technician, Medical Technician, Remote Team, and Space Weather Specialists.

Each student chose their three favorite jobs and applied for those. Mrs. Wanta, the Science teacher, assigned us our jobs, and gave us our jobs a few weeks later. This year I was a Communication Officer. You also got "your group," who are other students who have the same job as you, and you receive a packet to work on. In this packet were activities that will help you train for your job at Mars. At the Challenger Learning Center (CLC), we went on a mission to Mars. The Communication Officers (my group!) were important because we had to make announcements over the loudspeaker. Also we got to wear headsets, which I thought was super cool!

The Isolation Specialists used robotic arms and recorded data about the shuttle and other things that needed to be monitored. The Life Support Specialists made sure that everything on board the ship was going okay. The Navigators led us around in the ship. They needed to be good at math, which our Navigators this year certainly were! The Probe Technicians put together the space probes during the Comet Mission, and they needed to have strong mechanical skills. The Medi-



al Technicians monitored the health and conditions of the members of the space crew. They made them launch to Mars' moons named Phobos and Demos. They analyzed data and performed important tests. The Remote Team collected samples and analyzed data obtained from remote location. They needed to have good math skills and eye-hand coordination. Finally, there are the Space Weather Specialists, and they monitored the solar flares from the sun. They were responsible for the crew's safety throughout the trip.

In Mars Control, you got to find out information and send messages through an emailing system to the Communication Officer in your Control. I got all the messages and had to send them to the Spacecraft for messages to the workers there who have a hands-on experience. When the Spacecraft had reached Mars. we switched crews and the former Mars Control turns into the Spacecraft Control. My favorite part was the Spacecraft because I got to supervise all the jobs and yell at the people when the other Communication Officer from the new Mars Control had a message for a certain team. I liked watching the Isolation team use the robotic arms and take samples and the Medical Person monitor the crew's health. The Life Support team also took samples and analyzed data. The Space Weather Team monitored the solar flares from the sun

Overall, the Mars experience was very fun, and I really enjoyed it. I'm sure that the new 6th graders next year will have a ton of fun!



when he picked the Broncos.



A Nazi is a member of the National


