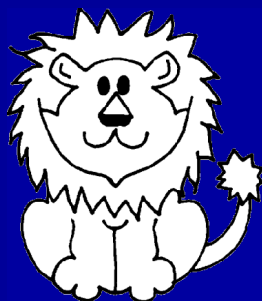

The Largest Cruise Ship in the World

The largest cruise ship in the world is called Allure of the Seas. This massive ship can hold a total amount of 8,565 passengers, including crew members. It weighs a whopping 100,000 tons. It costs 1.2 billion dollars. The fastest speed of this massive ship is 22.6 knots (26 miles per hour). After all it is a cruise ship, and cruise ships don't go fast at all. They are designed for luxury, not speed.

The Allure of the Seas is 213 feet above sea level at the highest point, and has 16 decks tall of extreme comfort. It is 1,187 feet long and 208 feet wide. The people

who built this are the S.T.Eck ship yard in Turku, Finland. It is built with a zip line and a full kitchen. Along with some dance floors and many theatres, the ship includes an aqua theatre. It also includes a full basketball court, surfing simulator, ice skating rink, spa, rock climbing wall, casino, nursery, fitness centers, Broadway shows, mini golf courses, and specialty restaurants.

370 people rescue vessels are included in case something bad happens to the ship. This is a little information about the largest ship in the world.

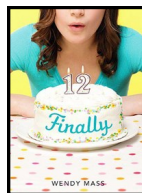
Wakfu was originally a video game that inspired the TV show.

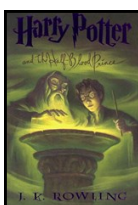

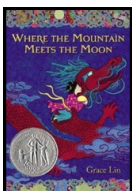
7. El Deafo by Cece Bell because it is an autobiography in graphic novel format. Cece gets sick very young and loses her hearing, but nothing stops her.

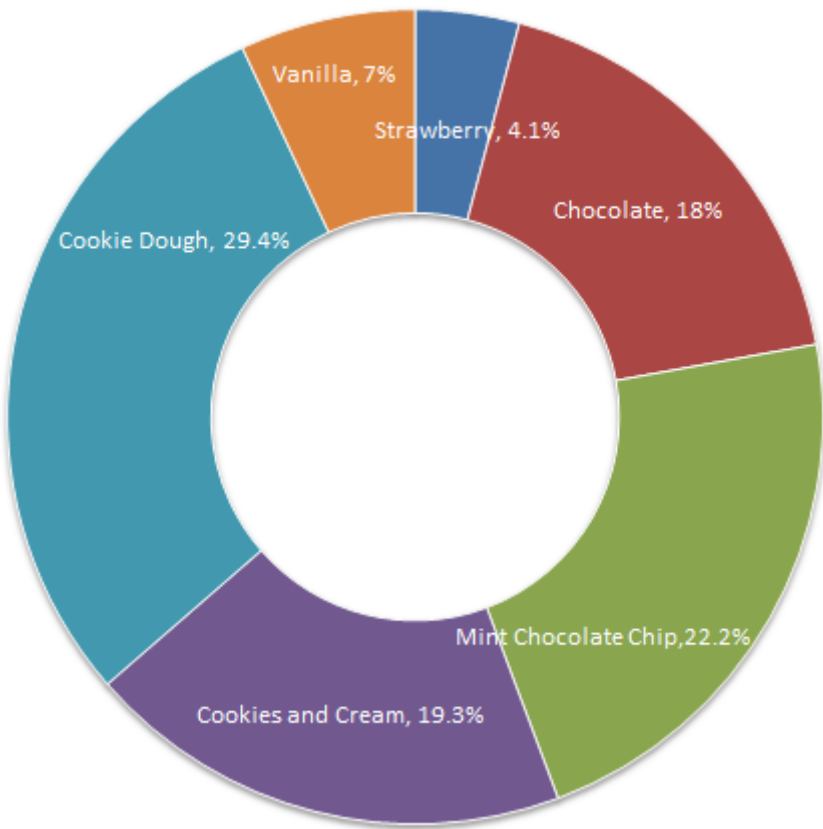

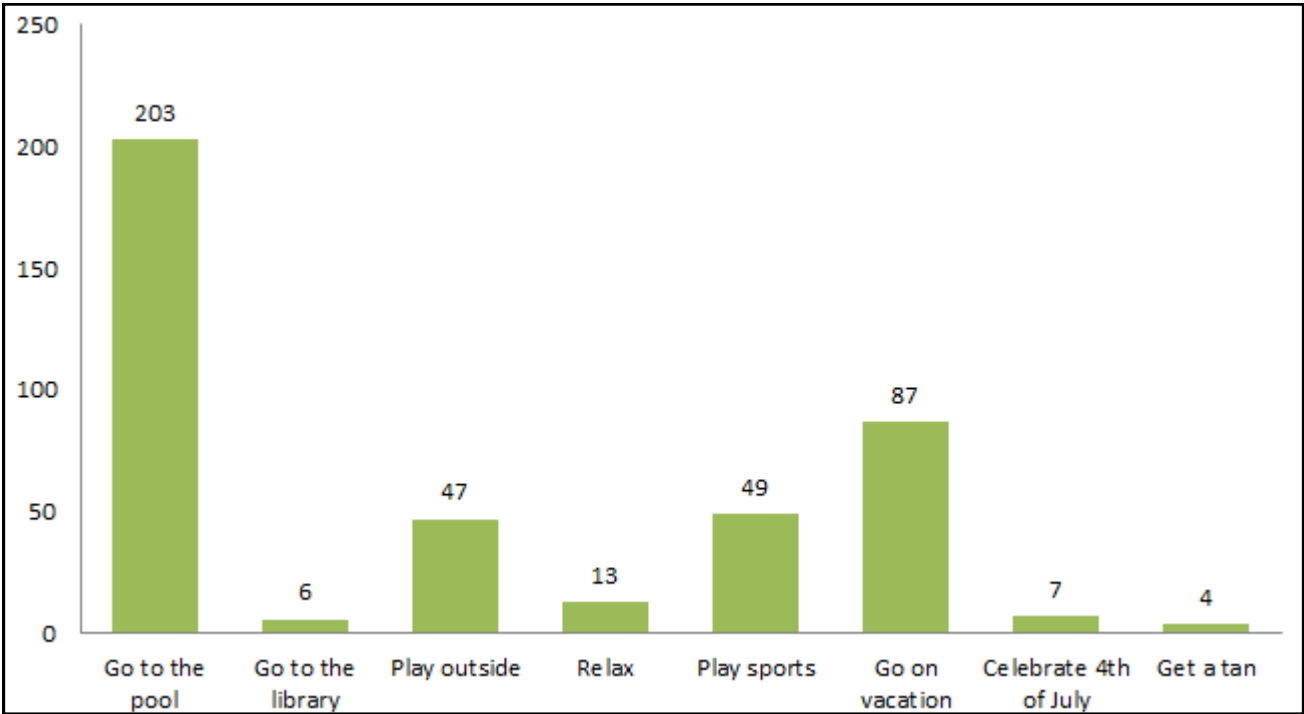

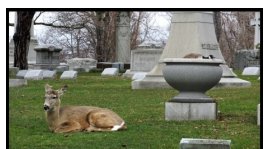

Yep! The list gets cuter from here! A Boston terrier pup actually

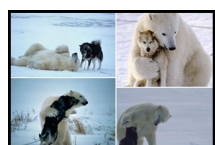
plays with three lion cubs and they even eat with each other! And there's actually footage of it on YouTube!

Now, Koko actually had a kitten but sadly the kitten died in a Car

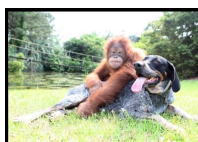
Accident. But then, later when Koko got a pleasant surprise and had got a new kitten! She cuddles and cradles the new kitten as Koko now is not depressed anymore!

#ForestPreservesRock

A great way to spend your summer is visiting our local forest preserves. In April, a naturalist from the Forest Preserve

District of DuPage County came to our school and talked about interesting plants and animals you can find in the forest preserves. For example, he explained that the Dutchman's Breeches plant looks like a pair of pants and the American Bittern bird sounds like a dripping faucet.

The forest preserves in DuPage and Cook counties offer really COOL summer classes and activities. These include canoeing, photography, horseback riding, bird watching, art, archery, nature walks (hiking), fishing, golfing, model crafts, navigation, camping, wildlife watching, and more. They also provide picnic and off-leash dog areas. In addition, many of the preserves have nature centers where you can learn about animals and the environment. If you are

very interested in protecting the environment, you can go to clean ups and do restoration work, like removing invasive species. The forest preserves even have special programs for Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts!

In DuPage County, the forest preserve closest to us is Fullersburg Woods. At this preserve, you can visit the nature education center and Graue Mill. At the nature center, you can learn about the plants, animals, and habitats in Fullersburg Woods. Kids can have fun climbing a tree tower and pressing stamps into a squishy table top to create animal tracks. Graue Mill has a very



interesting history and, today, Graue Mill is the only operating waterwheel gristmill in Illinois. You can visit the museum and take a tour to learn all about it. You can also observe nature and wildlife by taking a nice walk along one of the many paths in Fullersburg Woods.

Near us in Cook County is the Little Red Schoolhouse Nature Center. The center is in a beautiful natural setting, near a body of water called Longjohn Slough. The center was remodeled in 2010 and includes live animals, exhibits, and a children's activity room that has books, puzzles, a craft area, and native artifacts. During the summer, there are lots of special events there too. Some of the events in June are Garden in the Mornings, Cook County Critters, and Wild Wednesday Wonders. Many of the activities are free and don't even require registration.

So, don't forget to make time for nature this summer. From biking and hiking to fishing and camping, our forest preserves have something for everyone!
