## Welcome New Superintendent to the District, Dr. Ganan District 105 has recently concluded its search for

a new superintendent. They have announced that Dr. Brian J. Ganan, Ed.D. will start on July 1. He comes from District 94 in North Riverside, where he has served as Superintendent since 2015. Ganan holds a bachelor's degree from the

University of Iowa, a master's from DePaul University, and an Ed.D. from Roosevelt University. Dr. Ganan has prior experience as a Middle School English, Math and Spanish Teacher and taught English as a Second Language in Palma de Mallorca, Spain. He was also an Assistant Principal and Principal in Community Consolidated School District 59. He has been recognized internationally for his

research on the correlation between Spanish language oral reading fluency and success on high-stakes English reading assessments. This research was published in the International Education and Learning Review.






