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### Daily School/Work Health Screening:

We require this screening tool to be completed each day at home before boarding any transportation to school including buses and before arriving at the school building. Note that a temperature screening will also be required for everyone upon arrival at the school building.

**Do you (the employee or the student you are completing this form for) have today or have had within the past 10 days ANY of the following symptoms?**

- Fever (Temperature of 100.4 or higher). **Check you/your child's temperature each morning. Never treat a fever with fever reducing medication (such as Tylenol, Advil, Ibuprofen) and send a child to school or go to work.**
- Chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If no, continue on to next questions.

**If yes, your child/you must remain at home.** Contact your healthcare provider by phone or electronically. **A COVID-19 test is strongly recommended.** Illinois testing sites can be found

**Have you (the employee or the student you are completing this form for) been in close contact (within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more) with a person who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 (coronavirus) or is believed to be infected with COVID-19 (such as because they have/have had the above symptoms) within the past 14 days?**

**Or, have you (the employee or the student you are completing this form for) been contacted by a health department asking that you remain in quarantine at home?**

- If no, continue on to next questions.
- **If yes, your child/you must remain at home.** You must follow the CDC instructions here to return to school: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/if-you-are-sick/end-home-isolation.html> Monitor yourself and your family for symptoms (noted above). If you or your family members develop symptoms, contact your health care provider by phone or electronically to report the symptoms and the exposure to COVID-19. **A COVID-19 test is strongly recommended.** If symptoms develop, you will need to remain at home longer and must follow the CDC instructions for return to school.

**Are you (the employee or the student you are completing this form for) waiting on a COVID-19 test result because you think you might have COVID-19 or think you have had close contact (been within 6 feet of the infected person for 15 minutes or more) with a person diagnosed with or thought to have COVID-19?**

- If no, continue on to next questions.
- **If yes, your child/you must remain at home until you receive the results.** If the result is positive, you must follow the CDC instructions here to return to school: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/if-you-are-sick/end-home-isolation.html>

**If you (the employee or the student you are completing this form for) had COVID-19 like symptoms, and it is later determined by a healthcare provider that symptoms were not due to COVID-19 infection:** you must present written documentation of a negative test for COVID-19 and/or a healthcare provider note verifying you do not have COVID-19, and must be fever free without use of fever-reducing medication to return to school and free of vomiting and diarrhea for 24 hours

#### **Symptoms Outside of COVID-19 Symptoms That Require One to Stay at Home:**

1. Rash that has not been checked by a healthcare provider. (may attend with health care provider note stating he/she is cleared for school or has a chronic rash condition)
2. Eye symptoms of rubbing/itching, redness, crusting/lashes sticking together on waking, and/or yellow to green discharge. (may attend with health care provider note stating he/she is cleared for school or has a chronic eye condition)

3. *Severe* earache or stomachache that will make it difficult to participate in the school day.
4. Head lice and/or nits. (may attend after treatment and when all lice and nits have been removed from the hair and child has been checked and cleared by the school nurse).

**NOTE: At this time, we recommend that you avoid travel outside of the United States and to states that are on the Cook County Department of Public Health's (CCDPH) high incidence list. **If you do travel outside of the US or to one of the states listed for more than 24 hours, we recommend that you stay at home for 14 days from the time you returned home and monitor for COVID-19 symptoms.**

Notes:

Persons recovering from COVID-19 may need to be restricted from physical activities even after recovery and return to school. Please address this with the healthcare provider and provide a note to school regarding any needed restrictions.

**Make sure to call school to report all absences. Daily calls will not be required in situations where persons are known to be in quarantine or isolation for COVID-19 related reasons. Please report specific symptoms, any exposures to people diagnosed with or suspected to have COVID-19, any diagnosed or suspected cases of COVID-19 within your household, and any travel that requires quarantine.**

**Strong partnership between school and community members is required to minimize the impact COVID-19 could have on our school community. We ask that all individuals immediately and honestly report any COVID-19 related symptoms/diagnoses/exposures to school nursing/school administrative/attendance personnel. All such information will be handled in accordance with applicable privacy laws.** You may be directed to speak with the school nurse, and school nurses may contact you to follow up with COVID-19 related absences. Persons absent for COVID-19 related reasons will need to be cleared through discussion of symptoms/verification of completion of CDC criteria above by school nurses prior to return to school.

District 105 will be closely monitoring student and staff attendance, symptoms, and duration of absences to ensure that students and staff do not return to school until they meet the CDC criteria for return.

We will immediately communicate any concerning rises in absenteeism and any reported COVID-19 cases to the Cook County Department of Public Health and will follow their guidance.

**If students or staff develop any symptoms of COVID-19 during the school day, arrangements will be made for them to be separated from others while awaiting pick up from school.**

**Families, please make sure parent and emergency contact numbers are up to date in your school's office and that you have plans in place to quickly pick up or arrange for pick-up of your student in the event that he/she becomes ill at school. Please also make sure to answer any calls from public health departments, as these may be contact tracers working to notify you of potential exposures to COVID-19.**
